They have a passion for learning and a drive to become active citizens who value diversity. Our mission To provide a quality, differentiated education that is engaging, relevant and prepares students for their future. To provide practical, real life learning relevant to the curriculum. To foster a sense of discovery of the world in which our students live: both locally and globally.
School values	Our values Safe - We provide a safe environment for learning, social interaction and emotional development. Students are encouraged to take risks with their learning and recognise that mistakes are an important part of learning. We actively promote and support physical, mental and emotional wellbeing. Respectful- Staff, students and the school community treat each other and themselves with respect and consideration using courtesy and understanding. Students are explicitly taught the correct register of speech and body language to use in public situations. Ready to learn- With a positive attitude students take ownership learning and become independent, motivated learners. By articulating their mathematics and literacy goals and of their engaging in reflection, goal setting and peer evaluation students can celebrate their strengths and know what to focus on in future.
Context challenges	Key challenges for our school are: moderation of student work samples with teacher from other schools forward timetabling and planning of SIT, data analysis, observations and Learning Walks and Talks developing student voice, agency communication and engagement with families and communities
Intent, rationale and focus	Our school wishes to improve student outcomes in English and Mathematics and activate student agency and independence. We see these aspects as the key underpinnings of students being able to follow their interests and actualise their dreams. Developing students motivation and independence to learn using goal setting to map student pathways and develop agency and

leadership.

Agency, voice and engagement have been identified in Student attitudes to school and through the review process as areas for improvement.

We are prioritising reviewing and embedding an agreed instructional model. Analysis of data and using this to underpin collaborative planning and goal setting. We see this as integral to achieving our overarching goals.
